### OUR RESEARCH

India boasts the world's second-largest population, numbering approximately 1.35 billion individuals. Among this vast populace, about 158.8 million are children aged below six years. A notable subset of this juvenile cohort comprises 30 million orphans. constituting a significant portion of the nation's youth. Regrettably, only 370,000 of these orphaned children find themselves in childcare institutions. underscoring magnitude of the issue.

As India takes its place as the world's most populous country, it shines a spotlight on its immense and youthful workforce. With a median age of 28, India's population is ten years younger than China's. The country boasts the world's second-largest working-age population, and this demographic advantage is set to persist until 2049. India's potential workforce, totalling a staggering 960 million individuals, presents a remarkable opportunity to harness the true potential of its greatest asset - its people. The nation stands at the precipice of a transformative leap toward generating millions of jobs. However, realizing this potential hinges on a crucial prerequisite: enhancing the employability of its vast human resource pool in anticipation of the evolving









India's employability challenge encompasses two pivotal aspects:

- 1. Facilitating the transition from potential workers to active contributors to the workforce.
- 2. Empowering those already in the workforce with upskilling to prepare them for the demands of future jobs.

Notably, India faces a low Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) at 46%, primarily due to the limited participation of women in the workforce, accounting for only 27%. Simultaneously, a pressing skills gap looms large, particularly exacerbated by the fact that a substantial portion of India's workforce operates within the informal sector, where opportunities for skill development remain scarce.





# The Concern - An Increasing Number of Indian Orphans

The causes of the increasing number of orphans in India can be attributed to various underlying factors. One prominent factor is the formidable adoption process within the country. A substantial number of children in India become orphans due to their parent's inability to provide for them or the children escaping perilous circumstances. Given that over half of India's population grapples with poverty, many parents opt to abandon their offspring rather than attempt to care for them, as reported by the International Learning Movement (ILM).

In India, a child must be in an adoptive home or orphanage to be considered "legally free for adoption." Unfortunately, this criterion presents a significant challenge, as only 370,000 orphans reside in orphanages or adoption centers. Consequently, more than 29 million orphans remain ineligible for adoption, exacerbating their vulnerable predicament.

For the millions of orphans roaming India's streets, numerous perils lurk. Foremost among these dangers is the risk of trafficking, as defenseless children become prime targets for exploitation. Despite legal safeguards for street orphans, their physical protection remains inadequate, rendering them highly vulnerable, as highlighted by DW.








The 2022 U.S. Department of State's Trafficking in Persons report revealed that 47% of the trafficking victims identified in India were children, with 59% of these children being female. Young girls are often coerced into early marriages, with a troubling 27% wedded before their 18th birthday. Meanwhile, boys are frequently compelled into joining extremist groups, according to ILM. These harrowing statistics underscore the urgent need to address the challenges faced by India's orphaned population.

They often end up in unmaintained shelters and are forced to survive in pathetic conditions, live with extended relatives who want nothing to do with them, or in the case of women, married off to a stranger.

### BACKGROUND

Education has always been the cornerstone of societal development. At PABS Foundation, we believe that education not only imparts knowledge but also fosters critical thinking and resilience. In today's digital age, education is vital for survival and success. In a country like India, where socio-economic disparities persist, education becomes a powerful tool for solving societal challenges.



Some general statistics and trends related to education and upskilling challenges among orphans in India up to that date:

#### 1. Lack of Education:

- According to UNICEF, in India, there were around 20 million orphans as of 2021.
- The Ministry of Women and Child Development reported that only about 50% of orphaned children in India had access to education.
- 2. Dropout Rates: Orphaned children often face higher dropout rates. Dropout rates for orphans were estimated to be significantly higher compared to children with families, particularly after primary school.
- 3. Vocational Training: A lack of access to vocational training programs was a significant challenge for orphaned youth. Fewer than 5% of orphaned children in India had access to vocational training programs.
- 4. Employment Opportunities: Orphans who did manage to complete their education often struggled to find stable employment. Many ended up in lowpaying and unstable jobs.
- 5. Gender Disparities: Orphaned girls, in particular, faced challenges related to access to education and employment due to cultural and social factors.
- 6. Government Initiatives: The Indian has initiated various government address these issues. programs to including scholarships for orphaned children and vocational training programs. However, the reach effectiveness of these programs varied across different regions.







The Orphan kids need serious support, love, and care. Under the PABS Foundation, as a teamwork, we can bring change in kids' lives, and support and empower them. Additionally, girls won't be exploited in the name of Samuhik Vivah.


